After just six months in the AEF and BCEF family, I am keenly aware of how blessed and loved this agency is. Not a day goes by that **Mama** or **Donna Sachet**, **Lenny Broberg** or **Bob Brunson**, **Gary Virginia** or **Daddy Alan** or some other longtime supporter does not call to tell us about another event to benefit AEF or BCEF. Staff and board members spend our weekends attending dozens of community events and thanking people for their hard work and generosity. I am pleased to report that at the end of the first quarter of 2003, AEF is breaking even and is on budget—for the first time in several years. We still have a long way to go to raise the additional money needed to serve all our potential clients, but the trends are good.

I am thankful, too, for the vision and wisdom of **Fred Skau**, **David Slocombe** and so many others who built the Every Penny Counts program into such a visible and consistent source of support for our clients. Every day at least one bag of coins arrives from somewhere, usually totaling over \$1,000 per week. Each bag represents the generosity and kindness of hundreds of strangers who

drop their change into the Jars at locations all over town. Looking at the totals received over the years from some locations, I can see that it is true: every penny does count.

In April, Breast Cancer Emergency Fund (BCEF) celebrated its second full year of service to clients. In its first year, BCEF distributed \$36,000 among 61 clients, and in its second, \$52,000 among 87 clients. During these same two years, AEF granted over \$1,500,000 each year to people with HIV and AIDS. So, breast cancer clients represent about 3% of our total grants.

AEF's Board launched BCEF in 2001 to address the tremendous unmet need in the women's community, and to honor the years of work they had given in supporting AEF and people with HIV/AIDS.

When BCEF was established, the AEF Board put policies and procedures in place to ensure that there was no "co-mingling" of AEF and BCEF funds. This was done to respect the wishes of donors and to ensure the funds raised for either BCEF or AEF went to that specific effort. Breast cancer funding comes from BCEF-specific community events, such as those put on by 'Mama' Sandy Reinhart, and from community foundations like the Komen Foundation and Universal Care.

With shortfalls in AIDS funding from governments

and corporations, and cuts in client services this year, several donors and clients have expressed concern that BCEF might be pulling resources away from the AEF. In fact, the opposite is true. BCEF is fully funded with separate donations and, because of overall increased visibility, has attracted new donors to AEF. Best of all, AIDS Emergency Fund has been able to add this much-needed new program without incurring any additional staff costs. We have been able to meet the needs of more people without needing additional funds for overhead.

We are proud of the work we are doing to support people with breast cancer and are excited to see the success for the program after two years. It is rewarding to know that AEF's model of efficient and compassionate financial assistance—developed over 20 years by caring volunteers and staff—can so easily be put to use helping other communities. We're privileged to serve that part of the San Francisco community in most need—those people living with breast cancer or disabling HIV/AIDS. That we are able to do so is only because of your continued financial and volunteer support.
