The single greatest testament I can think of to the life of **Daddy Alan Selby** is that literally thousands of people are alive today because of him.

Another Hero Gone Too Soon

Daddy Alan started helping out at AIDS Emergency Fund in 1983 and spent the next 21 years raising hundreds of thousand of dollars so AEF could help others in need. His passion, humor and vitality attracted other volunteers and donors, and his leadership set an example for many to follow. As the owner of Mr. S Leather in the early days of the epidemic, Daddy Alan set the pace in the fight against AIDS. Even after he sold the business, Alan continued to walk the streets of the Castro and

the streets of the Castro and South of Market, soliciting auction items and donations from local merchants. As any of them will tell you, it was nearly impossible to say no to him. The leather title contest that Daddy Alan founded, SF Leather Daddy, has a 20-year history of supporting AIDS causes and has created an army of proud title holders committed to service and community. Alan also co-founded the Holiday Dinner for people with HIV/AIDS, an event that continues to offer love, companionship and hope to over 1,000 people each Christmas Eve.

Despite his declining health, Daddy Alan managed to get out of the house one last time the week before he died to attend AIDS Emergency Fund's awards gala. He had never missed one, and he made it clear he had no intention of missing this one. He had, of course, been honored many times at our galas, including our 20th Anniversary Gala in 2002. But this last one was different. He only stayed a short while, but was greeted by dozens of people eager to let him know how he had touched their lives and that he was loved.

Lest anyone be left with the impression that he was Mother Teresa, he definitely was not. Daddy Alan had a very, very good time—regularly and often. He packed more life into his 75 years than many of us could in two lifetimes. That he could do that and still find the energy, time and spirit to serve the community is what truly set him apart.

As a nurse at Sloan Kettering Hospital in New York during the first decade of the AIDS epidemic, I lost hundreds of friends and patients to AIDS — I saw them face not only horrible physical ailments, but unbearable financial hardship.

In 1995, while dealing with my own AIDS-related health issues, I retired from nursing and moved to San Francisco to be with my partner, Gavin. I was overjoyed to discover a network of people from all walks of life who valued compassion, gave generously and helped people they did not even know — the family of AIDS Emergency Fund, its volunteers and donors.

I recently wrote to most of you asking you to join the AEF family, renew your commitment to helping lowincome people with HIV and AIDS and become a donor to AIDS Emergency Fund. If you didn't respond to that request, please consider using the enclosed donation envelope to contribute today.

Once a month, I, like every board member, spend a day at AEF reviewing client files and signing checks on

behalf of clients. In the same way that I used to see the physical and psychological trauma of AIDS at Sloan Kettering, I now see the financial trauma of prolonged illness: formerly healthy and productive people, worn down by HIV, AIDS or breast cancer, unable to work, facing eviction, utility shut-off notices or daunting medical bills with no place to go. So they turn to the family at AIDS Emergency Fund.

Last year, AEF helped over 2,400 people stay warm and dry at night, keep their lights on and live with dignity in the face of illness and poverty. The federal government recently decreased San Francisco's share of Ryan White CARE Act funding by **four million dollars!** Because of this, many of our clients may no longer have access to dental care, transportation subsidies, mental health counseling and more. 
